Would you like to become a groomer operator? Our club is currently looking for qualified individuals that are willing to help maintain our trails as snow conditions permit. Interested members should have good mechanical abilities and a working knowledge of equipment operation. Grooming of the trails is typically performed at night, throughout the week, when traffic on the trails is at a minimum. The duration of a typical round trip grooming shift is between 6-8 hours in length. All potential operators will be required to complete the club's groomer operator training and the NYS Groomer Operator's Certification Course, as it becomes available. All operators <u>must</u> also assist in groomer maintenance and repairs as required to maintain our equipment.
